

## **Cub Scout Pack 5 ~ "Cake Auction"**

Calling all Cub Scout bakers, chefs, and those who simply like to mix ingredients in bowls!

Pack 5 needs you for its first annual "Cake Auction" (including non-cake items) on Thursday, May 31, 2007, from 7:00pm to 8:00pm in the Bach School multipurpose room.

Participation this year is open to all 2006-2007 Tigers, Wolves, Bears, and Webelos I and II. Advanced registration will be required and completed during our April Pack meeting.

Ribbons will be awarded by a panel of judges on the evening of the event: First, second, and third "Best in Show."

Additional certificates of recognition will go to baked goods in several other categories. Some of these will include the following.

- Most Creative Looking
- "The Diet Buster!"
- Most Nutritious Looking
- "Cake I'd Most Like to Eat"
- **1●1** Best Non-Cake Entry
- t⊚r Best "Open Class" Cake

Only one "food item" entry per Scout; however, feel free to indulge yourself in your interpretation of "cake" here ~ because we are awarding one baked good a "Best Non-Cake Entry" certificate. We'd also like to encourage non-Scouts to participate in our "Open Class" (which will be judged as a separate group). Judges' decisions are final.

**Don't bring your forks** and plates to this event, 'cause you won't be eating any of these tasty entries.

All entries here become the property of Cub Scout Pack 5, and right after the cakes are judged we'll be auctioning them off to the highest bidders. Scouts and families are welcome to bid on their own cakes, of course. (*Disclaimer:* Pack 5 can assume no liability fitness, taste or nutritional value of any item purchased.)

Net proceeds from all baked goods sales will go to District Friends of Scouting and will support our ongoing commitment to the Boy Scouts of America.

Any other rules? All Scouts involved this school year are eligible to participate and be considered for Pack 5 awards. Anyone else may register to compete in our "Open Class."

Participants will bring and place out their baked goods on tables the night of the auction when doors open for the event. Setup must be complete by 7:15pm, including any last minute touchups. After that, your cake is ours ~ so please be sure it's displayed on a serving dish or material that you do not need to get

back. Additionally, winning bidders from the auction will be responsible for packing and transporting the cakes they bought from Bach School. Remember our Scouting commitment to "Leave no trace!"

Tempting as it will be: No eating.

- Entries may be cakes or other baked goods, so long that this is an item or are items prepared by the entrant.
- All entries must be edible (excepting, of course, obvious decorations such as candles, plastic figures, and the like).
- Displayed entries must be confined to a space of not more than ~11" x 17" and be of appropriate weight and configuration to stand freely on a table.
- A complete list of food ingredients used must be provided with your display.

The leadership of Pack 5 reserves the right to reject any entry for any reason it may deem necessary.
